STEP 4: Review Award Classifications:

Emerging Leader Award— NEW! This award will be given to a young leader who has shown outstanding service and contribution to the Janesville community and who possess strong leadership skills to recruit, educate and mentor other emerging professionals who aspire to be a public/private owners and resources to the next generation of industry leaders.

Community Improvement Award—annually awarded to businesses or individuals who have demonstrated exemplary contributions to the well being of the Janesville community.

Goodwill Ambassador of the Year Award—annually awarded to an individual who has demonstrated exemplary representation of the business community. This individual has been a positive public relations liaison for Forward Janesville at ribbon cuttings, special events, and networking sessions. The individual has also been involved through extra committee work and projects. The Ambassador of the Year is nominated by his or her peer Ambassadors for the award.

Volunteer of the Year Award—annually awarded to an individual who has gone the extra mile in providing voluntary assistance to the Forward Janesville staff, committees, events and/or community projects.

Educator of the Year Award—awarded to an individual or group who has actively encouraged partnerships between the business and education communities. The nominee utilizes business resources within the community and works to adapt curriculum to align with the industry standards. Training, business partnerships, and advocacy for the educational system are key roles that this individual undertakes.

Entrepreneur of the Year Award— annually awarded to an individual who has exemplified leadership and the entrepreneurial spirit in making their ideas, and ultimately their business a success. The nominee must be a majority owner and/or operation head of an independently owned profit-making business enterprise that has less than 50 employees.

Business of the Year Award (50 or less employees) —awarded to a business who recognizes that business success and community involvement go hand in hand. The award is to recognize the exemplary customer service, product knowledge, community support, and professionalism that makes their business not only a profitable success, but a great asset to the Janesville community.

The award is to recognize the exemplary customer service, product knowledge, community support and professionalism that makes their business a financial success, but also an asset to our local community.

Lifetime Achievement Award—annually honors an individual, who over the course of several years, has made a real difference in our community, and also the Janesville business community.
